**The Old Colorado State Museum Building:** This building at 200 E 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue was designed by Frank Edbrooke in the Classical Revival style was built with Colorado materials, Yule Marble, and Cotopaxi granite. This building was the last building designed by Frank Edbrooke, who previously had designed our state capital. The building served as our state museum from 1915 until the museum's move to a newer location in 1976, at 13<sup>th</sup> & Broadway. (The museum again moved and was renamed History Colorado, to 12<sup>th</sup> & Broadway in 2012.) The old museum was restored in 1976 and now houses legislative offices, due to its proximity to the state capital. It is now known as the Legislative Services Building. [Personal note: I remember dragging a small chair or stool over by the WPA detailed diorama depicting Denver in 1860 and studying it for hours!! It is now on display at History Colorado]

**Breakfast Sausage Casserole** for a wonderful brunch!

1 pound pork sausage, 1 tsp. mustard powder, ½ tsp. salt, 4 large eggs, beaten, 2 c. milk, 6 slices white bread, toasted & cut into cubes, 8 oz. mild cheddar cheese, shredded. Crumble sausage into a skillet, cook until evenly brown, drain. In a bowl mix together mustard powder, salt, eggs in milk. Add sausage, bread cubes and cheese. Pour into a greased 9 x 13-inch baking dish. Cover & chill in refrigerator overnight. Preheat oven to 350°. Cover and bake 45-60 minutes. Uncover, & reduce temp to 325°. Bake and additional 30 minutes or until set.
